The Celtic Classic, the new 4 day dog show at the York, PA fairgrounds March 13-16, 2008, was great. The Mason Dixon Bernese Mountain Dog Club held its first ever regional specialty and supported the entries for the other three days here as well as holding its second AKC Sanctioned Plan B Match on Friday night.

The show committee, Christine Vlassis, Brenda Bedrosian, Dawn Cox, Jill Shaeffer, and Pat Mills put in many hours of planning ahead of time, and they worked very hard at the show serving up trophies, ways and means items, auction goodies and great munchies along with club members Jackie Caracciolo, Cathy Shipe, Maggie Saylor and April Clark as well as the rescue chairs Mary Merrill and Sue Eller. The committee built upon many years of holding a large supported entry at the old York Kennel Club show in July. Members Dede Laveran judged and Valerie Chase organized the Plan B Match.

The combination of a large silent auction, a huge raffle for a big crate filled with Berner goodies that Dawn Cox has been carrying around since Christmas, and a very well stocked ways and means store plus a small bit of the entry fee for each Berner brought in a little over \$3,000 to support club activities and expenses. The number of entries (109 on Saturday) made this a great first Berner regional specialty for the MDBMDC. And the Match was another step in the process of becoming an AKC licensed club.

They both moved very well but I felt the puppy had just a little more breed type but on a different day..... It was a very nice bitch entry over all. The Best of Breed class had some very nice dogs in it, my BOB dog is just a nice package with a great head, great movement, good bone and the Best of Opposite bitch gave him a run for his money, what a lovely bitch.
